DEA determined that these compounds were both essentially inactive, with no evidence of abuse potential. Pursuant to June 19th rulemaking (75 FR 37300), effective June 29, 2010, both benzylfentanyl (drug code: 9818) and thenylfentanyl (drug code: 9834) were no longer legally deemed to be controlled substances. Thus, neither benzylfentanyl (drug code: 9818) nor thenylfentanyl (drug code: 9834) is listed in this Notice of Registration despite being originally listed in the Notice of Application. (75 FR 36681)

No comments or objections have been received. DEA has considered the factors in 21 U.S.C. 823(a) and 952(a) and determined that the registration of Research Triangle Institute to import the basic classes of controlled substances is consistent with the public interest and with United States obligations under international treaties, conventions, or protocols in effect on May 1, 1971.
